

MEETING OF THE GAUGA COUNTY DISTRICT  
BOARD OF HEALTH

July 11, 1944

The Gauga County District Board of Health met on July 11th at the home of the Health Commissioner. All members of the Board were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Martin of Russell again presented complaints about the conditions on the farm of Mr. Wanz. Mr. Harvey S Steif showed to the Board a sample of water taken from Silver Creek which flows through Mr. Wanz' farm. The sample was filled with a thick slime, caused by the pollution of the water from the feeding grounds on Mr. Wanz hog lots. The Health Commissioner said that he would notify Mr. Wanz that this condition was a direct violation of the statutes of Ohio.

The ordinances governing the feeding of garbage to hogs in Gauga County which had been read at two previous meetings, was read for the third time. Mr. Baker moved that the ordinance be adopted as read. Mr. Davidove seconded the motion. Roll was called and the motion was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Riley moved that the Board accept Mr. Baker's offer to act as sanitary inspector. The motion was seconded by Dr. Shafer and carried.

The Board next considered a budget for 1945. After some discussion, Mr. Davidove moved that the Board present the following budget for 1945 to the Budget Commission:




Motion was seconded by Dr. Shafer and carried.

Dr. Corey reported that there was very little contagion in the county at the present time and that the Health Department was now busy with its summer Infant and Pre-school Clinics. He reported further that interest in the county hospital project seemed to be increasing and stated that the Farm Bureau Committee had met at his home to discuss the situation.
